the Original MS.S, and transcribed
in long-hand, by me,
April 6. 1822. John Smith, B.A.
of St. John's College,
and Deputy Esquire-Beckett to
the University of Cambridge.

May
Therefore resolve from this time, I
-woud to have it kept by my
people in long-hand, and
therefore, be contented to set
no more than is fit for them
all the world to know, or if
there be anything which can
be much to my amusemen-
are left, and my eyes hindered
me in almost all other pleas-
I must endeavour to keep what
is in my book open to add here
and there a note in short-hand
with my own hand. And so I bid
myself to that course, which
almost as much as to see my
go into my grave. For which,
all the discomfords that will accompa-
my being blind, the God God preserve
May 31. 1669. J. P. C.
