Through RE, children explore big questions about life, belief and belonging. They learn that people may hold different views and beliefs and that everyone's voice deserves to be heard. Children are encouraged to ask thoughtful questions, listen carefully to others and share their own ideas respectfully during discussions and enquiries.	Children learn that many religious communities have teachings, beliefs and practices which help guide the way people live. Through exploring religious leaders, stories and traditions, children begin to understand why rules, guidance and responsibilities are important to many people of faith.	Through the study of religion and worldviews, children learn that people hold different beliefs and values. They develop an understanding that individuals are free to hold religious or non-religious beliefs and are encouraged to reflect on and express their own ideas and responses respectfully.	Children are taught to reflect respectfully on religious ideas and respond thoughtfully to the beliefs, values and worldviews of others. Through learning about Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Humanism, children develop understanding of different beliefs, traditions and ways of life. Encounters with our persona characters, Grace and Abdul, faith visitors and places of worship help children develop empathy, challenge assumptions and build respectful attitudes towards people whose beliefs and experiences may differ from their own.
