<p>In all areas of the DT curriculum, children will have the opportunity to discuss design ideas with their peers. When exploring making a shelter and a chair for the class bear, children are encouraged to vote on specific design features and agree these as a group.</p>	<p>Children will use a range of materials, equipment and tools when making different products in DT. They understand how to keep themselves and their peers safe by following rules when...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • using sharp utensils to prepare healthy wraps and smoothies • using needles to join fabrics in textiles • using scissors, pins and tape to cut, join and fix materials together. <p>Children also develop their understanding of the importance of rules when designing and making products that meet a set design criteria.</p>	<p>When making their own smoothies and wraps, children have the freedom to express their taste preferences which they use to inform their design choices.</p> <p>Children are encouraged to take ownership of their own product designs. They also express their own personal creativity whilst considering their functionality of their designs and products, for example when...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • selecting characters for a moving book page • creating designs for their own fabric pouch 	<p>During the designing and creating processes, children have the opportunity to work in groups where they show respect for creative opinions that may differ from their own. Children are encouraged to listen to their peers, consider their ideas and give constructive evaluative feedback.</p>
