<p>In geography lessons, children show collaboration and develop decision making skills to help them understand the principles of democracy.</p> <p>Children will also regularly work as part of a team to answer geographical questions and deepen their understanding of how team decisions can be made fairly through majority votes (for example when deciding on the best placement of human and physical geographical features).</p>	<p>Children follow class rules during geography based tasks and activities to ensure everyone's safety and happiness, while also recognising the consequences if rules are ignored.</p> <p>Children will also show an understanding of rules and their importance when caring for our world and exploring how communities protect the environment. This helps children to notice how they have a part to play in looking after their local environment and take responsibility for this.</p>	<p>As part of their geography education, children have frequent opportunities to freely share their choices, ideas and opinions.</p> <p>As they explore different cultures, places and environments, children begin to understand how people have freedom to live in different ways and express themselves through their culture, festivals and traditions.</p>	<p>During their work in geography, children have opportunities to work cooperatively and show acceptance to the ideas and values of their peers.</p> <p>Children learn to be respectful when learning about the diversity between parts of the UK. They will explore how cities, towns and villages all have their own distinct features and show respect for this.</p> <p>Children show further tolerance for diversity when learning about different languages, cultures, traditions and celebrations from a range of countries around the world. Additionally, children show respect for other cultures and lifestyles which may differ from their own.</p>
