<p>Children will work together and make collective decisions when creating and performing music.</p> <p>Children work together and share responsibility in performances.</p> <p>In music, children are involved in creating short pieces of music together where they vote for musical elements, such as which instruments or sounds to use as a group.</p>	<p>Children are encouraged to follow rules in musical structures for example keeping to time, following a rhythm and musical cues.</p> <p>Children follow class rules during music, only using instruments when directed to ensure they can hear instructions or other performances.</p>	<p>Children can express themselves creatively through music, giving children the chance to select instruments that they feel more comfortable in playing.</p> <p>Children listen to different pieces of music and are encouraged to share their thoughts and feelings.</p> <p>Children can share ideas on how to improve sounds and music.</p>	<p>Children show respect towards their peers by listening to each other and valuing everyone's contributions.</p> <p>Children foster respect for other's talents, ideas and musical preferences.</p> <p>Children listen to music from a range of artists and composers helping them to respect diversity.</p>
