<p>Through their RE education, children explore how important it is for everyone to have their voice and their beliefs heard.</p> <p>Children know their views count. They listen to and value each other's views and values. Through conversation in RE lessons, children take turns and share their ideas.</p>	<p>Children become aware of some rituals that religious communities follow. They consider the importance of every member of faith doing their best to follow their religion.</p> <p>Children consider the idea of a leader as they explore key religious leaders and their teachings.</p>	<p>Through the study of religion pupils appreciate that people hold different beliefs. They become increasingly aware of the freedom that exists to choose their own beliefs.</p> <p>In RE lessons, children are exposed to a wide range of religious beliefs, stories and practices. They are encouraged to reflect and consider their own response to what they hear.</p>	<p>As children learn about religious beliefs, they are encouraged to show respect in their conversations and responses.</p> <p>Children consider the impact religious belief has on members of faith and their communities becoming aware of key Christian and Muslim practices and festivals. They respect that certain times of year are special for members of faith.</p> <p>Children show respect when listening to others share their experiences and ideas in response to their learning. When members of faith visit school, children also show respect.</p>
